MARBLE, METAL & GLASS FURNITURE USE & CARE

MARBLE

Marble is a hard form of limestone which is thousands of years old.
Marble is typically white with coloured mottling or streaks. Due to this each piece may vary in colour and finish. Therefore no 2 pieces will be the same
Marble is a natural product and colour variation may occur

GLASS

Glass is toughened
Always use place mat to maintain and protect the surface.
Do not place hot objects in direct contact with the glass.
Wipe with a damp cloth, followed by a soft, dry cloth.
Do not use harsh abrasives or household cleaners as they may scratch and damage the finish.

METAL FRAME

Wipe with a soft, dry cloth.
Do not use harsh abrasives or household cleaners as they may damage the finish.
Securely tighten all connections during assembly.
Hardware may loosen over time; periodically check that all connections are tight.
Do not drag table once assembled.
Do not stand or sit on the glass table
Not suitable for bathrooms or children's rooms

Caring for your metal foiled frame and marble furniture:
Heat and moisture will affect marble.
Always use place mat to maintain and protect the natural surface.
Do not place hot objects in direct contact.
Wipe with a soft, dry cloth.
Do not use harsh abrasives or household cleaners as they may damage the finish.
The marble surface is not treated.
Marble is porous and liquids can stain or etch the surface.
Do not use chemicals and household cleaners as they might damage the finish.
Any spills should be immediately blotted with a damp cloth.
For stubborn stains use a mild dishwashing up liquid and a soft damp cloth

1. Mix warm water and gentle washing up liquid:
Don't use anything with acid or lemon juice.
2. Wipe the surface with the soapy solution
3. Followed by a hot, wet dish cloth to remove any soapy residue
4. Dry with a soft absorbent towel: Rub the countertop dry and buff with a soft, absorbent towel.
